There is a competitive *Britannia Cup* 4+, with new boys Tom Parker, Ben Pugh, Alex Cavell, Jack Drea and cox Nick Ford, and another Brit entry which has to qualify. There's also a *Visitors*' slot for Brookes boys Ed Fox and Robbie Kennedy, teaming up to composite with Matt McQuillan and Andy MacPherson from London RC, but also entered in the *Goblets* as a pair and ready to give Pinsent & Cracknell a good thrashing.

The women also play the composite card: cox Caroline O'Connor along with rowers Heike Assmuss, Vicky Brierley, Briony Oldale and Marianne Nordahl recently won the club coxed fours at Henley Women's. They've now hooked up with four OUWBC students to try and defend the Remenham Challenge Cup for W8+: the Stewards have unkindly made them qualify.

Top men's boat this time is a (guess what) *Visitors' 4-:* Richard must have lost count of the number he's put entries in for over the years. This time it's the turn of Henry Bailhache to row with old duffers Tommy Burton, Dan Marett and Phil Baker. Don't be fooled by their recent second-place Marlow Regatta result they rowed with one crewmember who had been chucking up blood - these guys are fast (again).

After Henley there are plans to take at least the W4+ and perhaps some men's crews to the *National Championships*, with the goal of winning *Home Countries* selection (it's in Ireland this year: party time!). So the Brookes juggernaut rolls on – get those blazers out and stand ready to yell for the crews!
